

Ashridge Estate

Parking address: Moneybury Hill, Ringshall, Berkhamsted HP4 1LT.



Parking: The Ashridge Estate has a very long drive (maybe 400 metres or more?) leading up to its monument and Visitor Centre area. Most of the time cars can park on either side of the drive on grass verges. In addition there are a few dedicated car parks. On peak visitor days the Ashridge Estate gets extremely busy, but we doubt that the available parking space ever gets fully filled.

Walk: There are notice boards posted with suggested short circular routes around parts of the estate. Follow one of these or do your own thing. Bear in mind that the park is around 5000 acres, so try to maintain your bearings, otherwise you may end-up walking for much longer than you planned.

We have walked at the Ashridge Estate on 3-4 occasions, taking different routes each time. The park is mostly not too hilly, but you might want walking boots when it's wet. The paths get pretty muddy in places, and if you decide to go 'off-road' in the forested areas then obviously there are plenty of tree roots to stumble on.

The estate is bicycle and dog friendly.

Food and drink: There is a cafe in the park which does good quality hot and cold snacks. Although they have plenty of staff, service can be a bit slow when it gets busy. If it's a warm day you should seriously consider taking a picnic.
