

Weston Turville Reservoir



Parking address: World's End Lane, Weston Turville, Bucks.

Parking: There is no postcode for the reservoir, but if you put World's End Lane into your satnav you'll find the reservoir.

There is no car park, as such, but the reservoir has a very long layby by the entrance. See below.



No big signs up, just this gate at one end of the layby.



All of these vehicles are parked in the long layby. The gate is at this end.

Walk: Despite any impressions to the contrary that our pictures may give, the reservoir itself is not that big. Our video shows a walk in the anti-clockwise direction.

As you follow the path around the reservoir you end-up leaving the reservoir land for about fifty meters and walking along an adjacent road before rejoining reservoir land via a different entrance, to then pick-up the final leg of the circuit.

As you come back onto the reservoir land there is a wood immediately to your right. If you go into the wood you will quite soon come across the Wendover Arm, which is part of the Grand Union Canal, and has a natural spring as its water source at a place called Wellhead. It's a very attractive section of water, and it's worth the slight detour.

The path around the reservoir is compacted stone and earth. The final leg (assuming that you have travelled anti-clockwise), after the wood, is pretty bumpy, and you would want boots in wetter weather, and possibly at all other times.

Food and drink: We don't know this area very well, so cannot personally recommend a place to eat. That said, the Chandos Arms pub is very near and the website pictures certainly do it justice. The menu also looks reasonably priced.

We definitely think it's worth a try.
