



Fen Drayton Lakes

Parking address: RSPB Fen Drayton Lakes, Holywell Ferry Road, Cambridge, CB24 4RB.

Note: the official address is **Fen Drayton Road**. Something doesn't tally, but the place is easy enough to find.

Parking: On site parking is at the address, above. The car park is generally big enough to cope with daily demand.



Parking is available on site.



There is a shelter-style visitor information hut beside the car park.

Walk: Fen Drayton Lakes in Cambridgeshire is another RSPB bird sanctuary and nature reserve that began life as gravel pits. Excavations were completed in 1992. Thereafter, the pits were allowed to flood naturally and the area was turned over to nature.

There are at least three major lakes at the site, around 12 in all, with approximately 10 miles of walking trails.

Animals and insects that are regularly seen at Fen Drayton include dragonflies, damselflies, swans, geese, and even otters. Some of the meadows are used for grazing cows – as our video shows.

The River Great Ouse is adjacent to the lakes, and a walk along the river's footpath is easily incorporated into your visit.

Food and drink:

The Three Tuns at Fen Drayton is a Tudor restaurant/pub.
